Lockyer v Brisbane: 2nd Division 9th July at Cahill **Park**

Lockyer won the toss and batted on nice sunny winter day, with slight westerly breeze at Cahill Park in Gatton. The pitch had good covering of grass and was slow with variable bounce.

Lockyer lost the first wicket in the second over, with only one run on the board, no fault of the pitch or bounce. All the top order batsmen found runs hard to come by as the Brisbane bowlers bowled a good line and length. Lockyer lost wickets at regular intervals as the batsmen got settled at the crease and then tried to force the pace, only to come undone and at the 26 over mark Lockyer had struggled to 6/52. Then a middle order rear guard partnership between Neil Kajewski (34 runs from 38 balls) and Terry Seach (23 not out from 40 balls) and a handy innings of 8 not out from 20 balls from Ray Tiley and 11 runs from 14 balls from number 11 Jeff Evans helped get Lockyer to 8/137 from their allotted 45 overs. Ross Towner (2/12 from 8 overs) and Phil Lambert (1/9 from 8 overs) bowled very well at the top of the order. They were well backed up by Harvey Wright (2/19 from 7 overs) Dave Walton (1/8 from 4 overs) Lindsay Holmes (1/30 from 8 overs) and Des McKeever 1/34 from 6.2 overs).

After a delightful lunch at the Leagues Club at Cahill Park, it was Brisbane 's turn at the crease. Brisbane suffered the same fate as Lockyer, losing an early wicket in the first over. Opener Phil Lambert (11 runs from 18 balls) and Lindsay Holmes (12 runs from 26 balls) started to resurrect the innings but both fell with the score on 24.

Brisbane captain Mark Hind (19 runs from 31 balls) and Des McKeever (20 not out from 46 balls) did their best to push the score along but the wickets kept falling. Brisbane were well ahead of the Lockyer total at the 30 over mark being 5/93 compared to Lockyer 's 6/63, but after drinks the Lockyer bowling and fielding put the pressure on the Brisbane batsmen and they started to take some risky runs, but unfortunately they came unstuck, as Lockyer fieldsman Darryl Ready and Jeff Evans both secured run outs. Des McKeever the first retiree for Brisbane returned to the crease with Brisbane requiring 8 runs from the final over to get them home but unfortunately they could only manage three singles and Lockyer came away with a four run victory.

Tribute must be made to Terry Seach and Ray Tiley who were Brisbane players but filled in for the Lockyer side on the day and both made significant contributions to the Lockyer side victory.

Once again a cliff hanger, a very enjoyable game of cricket and cricket was the real winner. Report contributed by Darryl Ready





Lockyer v Redlands at Rope Hill Div 1 July 23

Lockyer won the toss and elected to bowl on a sunny, but windy day at Rope Hill.

Redlands started cautiously but solidly, and had negotiated their way to 29 from 8 overs when John Gardner play an impatient shot and was bowled for 16 made from 23 balls. Phil Lambert came to the crease and showed his intent by hitting a boundary 4 from the third delivery he faced but he to found the gaps in the field hard to find. Rod Rice(11 runs from 29 balls) fell in the next over and Steve Larrescy (8 runs from 18 balls) followed 4 overs later. Phil Lambert (26 runs from 33 balls) including 5 fours, was the next to depart and when he was followed by Ken Luxton two balls later, Redlands were in trouble at 5 for 73. Phil Van de Kley(25 runs from 70 balls) batted defiantly with the lower order but the runs were coming slowly and wickets were falling at regular intervals and eventually Redlands were dismissed in the 44th over for 117 runs.

After lunch Lockyer took to the crease and they too started cautiously, and like Redlands they lost the first wicket in the 9th over when Jamie Dowe (13 runs from 25 balls) tickled a Van de Kley delivery to the keeper, John Gardner. Van de Kley struck again in the 13th over when he trapped Graham Zirbel (27 runs from 40 balls) lbw and again in the 19th over when Maurie Werth (11 runs from 18 balls) also gave John Gardner some catching practise behind the wicket and Lockyer were 3 wickets down with 75 runs on the board. If Redlands were to have any chance they had to bowl Lockyer out but unfortunately a couple of catches went to ground and a solid knock from Wayne Sander (31 not out from 48 balls) and a whirl wind 34 from 19

balls from Len Martin which included 6 fours and a six saw Lockyer home by a margin of 6 wickets.

This maintains Lockyer's unbeaten run in the Division one competition and has assured them of a birth in the final on the 21st August. Report supplied by Darryl Ready.



Over 70s Tour of England


