Welcome to the season from the QVC President




Welcome to the 2026 season for veteran's cricket. I've recently taken on the role of *President of QVC* following the AGM where Rod Rice stepped down as President after many years as part of the QVC committee. I'd like to thank Rod for his dedication to promoting veterans cricket as an administrator, umpire and player. Fortunately, Rod will stay on with us as the O70s Age delegate. We recently bestowed upon him Life membership of QVC (see picture below).

- We have a very full year with over 65 teams committing to play in the QVC winter competition in O50s and O60s. We also have an interest in the O40s competition as well, however this is managed by Queensland Cricket. Our colleagues in North Queensland will also be running veterans cricket competitions and we will continue to have them part of our arrangements through the year.
- We have plans for a number of tournaments hosted in Queensland this year and we are also sending players interstate to represent us. We have already had a few tournaments completed (O40s, O70s, O60s Port Jackson tournament).
- It is with great pride that we recognise Qld players who have been selected in the many active Australian sides who are touring all over the world. We have named our players below. Congratulations and good luck to all of them.
- We are in the process of updating our website and our delivery of communications through our Facebook channels. We are also looking to increase our communications on various issues to the Regional Coordinators. Please ensure they are passing on the key messages to you and your fellow players. If there is a good story you'd like to include in Newsletters or on the website, we are always on the lookout for good content and photos. Please send them to Paul Jelfs.
- We have changed our administration arrangements for QVC this year. We have formed a Management Committee of the four elected positions (see below) and a Subcommittee of the remaining nominated or selected positions (eg age delegates, operations managers, financial controller, umpires adviser, registrar). This will allow some quick focused decision making for key issues and allow the Management Committee to draw in advice from selected members of the subcommittee as needed. At the same time, we are re-writing our Constitution, which has become quite outdated, to align with modern standards and legislation. This revised version will be put to members throughout the year for views.

- Our winter competitions will run from the 11th April to the end of August. We will have 4 Divisions for O50s and 3 Divisions for O60s. We are pleased to see that some of our women players will again play in the men's O60s competition and I'm sure they will be even more successful than they were last season.
- We are in the process of forming the O50s and O60s operations sub committees to assist the operations managers to deal with player exemptions, rule judgements and disciplinary issues throughout the competition.
- It's important to note that we have tried to keep fees for playing cricket as low as we can for the season. In doing this we have removed the expectation that lunches will be provided at each match. If clubs want to provide lunches at a cost they can do this in a negotiation between the teams – this might be good in situations where teams are travelling long distances or there are no local food outlets. So don't forget to take your lunch to the matches.

QVC winter competition

- The competitions for both O50s and O60s will commence on the weekend of the 11th April and O60s will finish on the weekend of the 29th August. O50s will finish on the 23rd August with a finals reserve day on the 30th August.
- Over 60s will not play on the ANZAC weekend, however the O50s will continue to play. While not finalised as yet, the O50s competition may break to accommodate the Quad series.
- The draws have been finalised with grounds and exact dates being allocated by Regions. The final draws will be released loaded to PlayHQ.
- O50s and O60s matches will predominantly be on a Saturday, however the home team may advise that the match will be played on a Sunday due to ground availability. This will be advised through the draw.
- QVC will again work with Queensland Cricket to provide support services to Regions on the match days. Assisting in wet weather scenarios (ground closure, reallocation or delays).
- Playing conditions have been released to the Regional Coordinators for the O50s and will be shortly released for the O60s. The O50s have implemented a rules/exemptions committee comprising Andrew Knight, Joe Laffey and Jeff Mays. O60s will announce a similar committee shortly.


Upcoming tournaments - Cooper Finlay – Ready Henry Shield

Veteran Women's cricket

The women's arena is looking promising as we gear up to hosting the National Championships in 2027. EOIs for the upcoming playing opportunities for veteran women cricketers have been circulated, with an excellent response to date. The women's committee will continue to communicate via the current email system but will shortly have a dedicated QVC address for queries and mass communications.

Planned playing opportunities include:

Over 60's men's winter competition commencing for the Sunshine Coast White side 18 April, 2026, at home.

Ready-Henry Shield (evolving with the Cooper Finlay competition), 6-7 June, 2026, at Everton. Two sides will contest a State of Origin series against our NSW colleagues. This will be the inaugural competition (due to being rained out last year), with both Marg Ready and Jess Henry in attendance. Their contributions to launching veteran women's cricket in both states should continue to be recognised.

Veteran Women's National Championships in Tasmania October 2026, with details to be advised. It is anticipated that Queensland will field 2 or 3 sides, depending on the championship details and player interest. Practice matches will also be notified as grounds become available. These will be open to all veteran women who wish to play and will be geared for participation above competition.
